# **Adults, Older People & Dementia**

Scottish Fire and Rescue Service Guidance: How to make a referral for a Home Fire Safety Visit (HFSV) - guidance for partner organisations

Guidance from Scottish Fire and Rescue Service about how to make a referral for a HFSV for partner agencies.

## Scotland to Host Dementia Research Challenge

Researchers at the Universities of Glasgow and St. Andrews are hosting a first-of-its-kind research challenge for teams from around the globe who are focused on new dementia breakthroughs.

#### Ageism and the Abuse of Older People

The briefing from the Older People's Commissioner for Wales aims to encourage organisations and practitioners to consider the ways that ageist attitudes and assumptions perpetuate the abuse of older people and shape their own responses to addressing that abuse.

# <u>Supporting Engagement with Reablement: A Practice Guidance Resource for</u> Reablement Services

This resource sets out evidence-informed guidance on addressing the barriers to securing, maintaining and maximising older people's engagement with reablement, and the support and collaboration of family members. It draws on findings from a national study into client and family engagement with reablement (the EAGER project) led by the University of York and funded by NIHR's School for Social Care Research.

# Care Home Improvement Programme - Cohort One Flash Report

The Care Inspectorate delivered the first cohort of the Care Home Improvement Programme (CHIP) between April and August 2024. The aim was to support care home staff to apply quality improvement, to improve outcomes for people experiencing care. This cohort focused on the Greater Glasgow and Clyde, and Forth Valley areas to allow care homes to build connections and peer support within their local area. Participation in the programme was voluntary. Adult care homes with a grade 3 from their most recent inspection were invited to apply to take part.

## Preventing and Disrupting Cuckooing Victimisation: Professional Toolkit

Resources from the University of Leeds, which have been designed to improve awareness of cuckooing victimisation, encourage professional and public curiosity, and improve reporting and intervention.

A review that synthesised the findings of empirical literature on the experiences of carers of people with a mental illness.

<u>Responding to Online Extremism – Guidance for Professionals and Parents</u>
SWGfL has published an article about the rise of online extremist content and how parents, carers and professionals can respond to protect children and young people.

The article covers key points developed by the <u>Professionals Online Safety Helpline</u> about how to approach online extremist content with children and young people.

## Fostering and Adoption Statistics 2019/20 to 2023/24

An annual statistical report that provides insight into the operation of fostering, adoption and continuing care services in Scotland over the past five years.

Permanently Progressing? Building Secure Futures for Children: Phase 2 Report This report presents the findings from the second phase of a project looking at the lives of all 1,836 children who became looked after in Scotland aged five or under in 2012-13, tracking their progress from infant to adult.

#### Young People's Experiences of Online Sexual Extortion or 'Sextortion'

This NSPCC briefing shares children and young people's experiences of so-called 'sextortion', a form of online blackmail that involves the threat of sharing nude or semi-nude images or videos to extort money or force someone to do something against their will.

# A Place to Call Home: Understanding what makes a good home for children in care across the UK

Action for Children has launched a campaign and series of reports on understanding what makes a good home for children with a Scotland specific report on home quality within the children's social care system.

#### Child Criminal Exploitation and the Interactional Emergence of Victim Status

This article draws on observations and interviews with youth justice practitioners and young people involved in county lines drug dealing to explore the processes by which young people are identified as victims of child criminal exploitation (CCE).

#### Insights on Responses to Children Experiencing Online Harm and Abuse

This briefing uses insight from Childline counselling sessions and NSPCC Helpline contacts to share the types of responses children receive after they have told someone about their experiences of online harm or abuse.

This study aimed to a) establish the prevalence of recorded ADHD b) characterise and compare individuals with and without ADHD in terms of health and social

variables, and c) assess whether ADHD was associated with an increased risk of missing scheduled appointments in general practice.

# <u>Culturally Adaptive Healthcare for People with a Learning Disability from an Ethnic Minority Background</u>

A qualitative review that compared findings from 28 UK studies which explored the healthcare experiences of people with a learning disability from ethnic minority backgrounds, and their carers.

NSPCC Learning, with the PSHE Association, has updated its Talk PANTS resources for nurseries and primary schools to help keep children safe from sexual abuse.

# Who is Losing Learning?: The case for reducing exclusions across mainstream schools

This report explores the rising tide of lost learning and sets out a strong economic case to invest in reducing escalations. They introduce an 'exclusions continuum' that brings together different datasets and presents an overview of the rising prevalence of children losing learning, whether through absence, suspension, internal exclusion or the 11 other types of lost learning we have identified.

<u>Understanding the Causes of Missingness in Primary Care: a realist review</u>
Although missed appointments in healthcare have been an area of concern for policy, practice and research, the primary focus has been on reducing single 'situational' missed appointments to the benefit of services. Little attention has been paid to the causes and consequences of more 'enduring' multiple missed appointments in primary care and the role this has in producing health inequalities.

key themes in order that they can proactively support children to understand and assert their rights and keep them safe. Early Protective Messages (EPM) operates across the early years' estate NHS boardwide.

The link gives a brief overview of Early Protective Messages (EPM) and directs colleagues to a portal at <u>earlyprotectivemessages.scot.</u> Glasgow City Health Improvement needs to build capacity within appropriate staff groups and invite relevant and interested staff to participate in a 2 day training for trainers programme in order that they can then deliver EPM sessions across Glasgow City early years estate.

**Adult Support and Protection Multi Agency Training Awareness Webinar** 

A multi-agency webinar delivered by Learning and Development, Glasgow HSCP (Health and Social Care Partnership) to support practitioners to gain a basic understanding of Adult Support and Protection (ASP) legislation. It may be used as a basic awareness or if you already have some knowledge of ASP and wish to refresh your skills. This is a multi- agency awareness session and will webinar-based with a maximum of 60 participants. There will not be a waiting list so if you are unsuccessful you will require to reserve an alternative date. Participants will:

- develop their understanding of what we mean by an adult at risk within the context of the Adult Support and Protection (Scotland) Act 2007;
- define who may be an adult at risk of harm;
- recognise forms of harm adults may experience;
- know how to report their concerns.
- explain their responsibility in relation to Adult Support and Protection.

Due to the high demand for the training, we recommend that you book 1 place but having up to 8 additional staff members join in your room and attend this training session.

#### **Child Protection Awareness Multi-Agency Online Training**

This multi-agency training will support practitioners to gain a basic understanding of Child Protection, even where your job is such that you have no direct responsibility for providing a service to them. It may be used as a basic awareness or if you already have some knowledge of Child Protection and wish to refresh your skills. Participants will:

- Understand types of harm and the potential impact on a child;
- Understand your role and responsibility in recognising and responding to the risk of harm;
- Understand the process and importance of information sharing;
- Understand the processes professionals take to assess and support any child at risk of harm.

Commissioned as part of the National Trauma Transformation Programme (NTTP), this report presents the findings from a follow-up evaluation of three local delivery trial sites in Argyll & Bute, Glasgow and Midlothian, which were established in 2019.

#### National Trauma Transformation Programme: workforce survey 2024

This report presents the main findings from a survey carried out with the workforce in Scotland exploring awareness and attitudes to psychological trauma and trauma-informed practice. The survey was carried out by the Improvement Service as part of the National Trauma Transformation Programme.
