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NATIONAL CARE HOME CONTRACT SETTLEMENT (2020/21)

Purpose of Report:	The purpose of this report is to update the IJB on a one year National Care Home Contract (NCHC) settlement for 2020/21 and the commitments within the contract in relation to the Living Wage and Agenda for Change band 5 and the proposed increases on our other commissioned services.
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Background/Engagement:	The NCHC is a national contract which is negotiated across Scotland and full engagement of Scottish Councils via COSLA
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Recommendations:	<p>The Integration Joint Board is asked to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) note the increased rates from 6 April 2020 as outlined in Appendix 1; b) agree to apply the NCHC contract uplift to commissioned services attached in Appendix 1; c) agree to allocate £2.423m to pay for the care home fees uplift and Living Wage settlement; and d) instruct the council to vary the contracts with providers in line with the conditions at 4.3.

1. Purpose

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to update the IJB on a one year National Care Home Contract (NCHC) settlement for 2020/21 and the commitments within the contract in relation to the Living Wage and Agenda for Change band 5 and the proposed increases on our other commissioned services.

2. Background

- 2.1. The NCHC is subject to national negotiation. This negotiation sets the rates which will apply for 2020/21 and also the expectations in relation to the payment of Living Wage and Agenda for Change band 5 by providers.

3. Implications of 2020/21 fee uplift

- 3.1 The rates attached at Appendix 1 are applicable from 6 April 2020. A rate of 3.51% has been applied to nursing care and 3.54% for residential care. These rates will be applied to both the NCHC and the other commissioned services which are included at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 The cost of the uplift of £2.423m will be funded from the additional monies provided by the Scottish Government to integration authorities in 2020/21.

4. Living Wage and Agenda for Change band 5

- 4.1 The NCHC financial settlement for 2020/21 requires all providers delivering publicly funded care to pay all care workers, regardless of age, experience or time in employment, a minimum of £9.30 per hour from 6 April 2020.
- 4.2 The contract also commits providers employing registered nurses and delivering publicly funded care to pay nursing staff Agenda for Change band 5 top point.
- 4.3 On this basis the National Care Home Contract will be varied to ensure:
- Any provider delivering publicly funded care must pay all care workers a minimum of £9.30;
 - Any provider delivering publicly funded care must pay nursing staff Agenda for Change band 5 top point;
 - Providers agree that remuneration can be periodically monitored by the commissioning authority, including direct verification with employees of the provider;
 - There will be no displacement of other costs onto staff by the employer.

5. Recommendations

5.1 The Integration Joint Board is asked to:

- a) note the increased rates from 6 April 2020 as outlined in appendix 1;
- b) agree to apply the NCHC contract uplift to commissioned services attached in Appendix 1;
- c) agree to allocate £2.423m to pay for the care home fees uplift and Living Wage settlement; and
- d) Instruct the council to vary the contracts with providers in line with the conditions at 4.3.
