LEITHLAND OLDER PERSONS CARE HOME AND DAYCARE CENTRE NEW BUILD PROJECT – TENDER ACCEPTANCE

Purpose of Report:	To advise Committee of the decision of Council Executive Committee of 27 October 2016 to approve the award of the contract for the construction of the "Leithland Care Home and Daycare Centre" to City Building (Glasgow) LLP for £22,396,501 within an overall project budget of £23,618,251.

- 2.2 The new Leithland Care Home and Daycare centre is the fourth care Home to commence under the Social Work services new-build programme of works.
- 2.3 The attached Council Executive Committee paper at Appendix 1 outlines the detail of the tender process and a breakdown of the project costs.

Consulted:

1. Leithland Older Persons Care Home and Daycare Centre

- 1.1 On 11th September 2014 the Executive Committee agreed to the construction of a care home and daycare centre at Leithland.
- 1.2 The Executive Committee agreed that the new Care Home and Daycare Centre would be traditionally procured through the appointment of Development and Regeneration Services Project Management & Design (PM&D) for project design, contractor procurement, and construction management, with City Building (Glasgow) LLP being appointed contractor under Teckal, subject to Best Value being evidenced. PM&D prepared all of the contract documentation and have appraised the completed and returned tender.
- 1.3 The new Leithland Care Home and Daycare Centre is the fourth Care Home to commence under the Social Work Services new-build programme of works.

2. TENDER PROCESS

- 2.1 Tender documentation was prepared following Client agreement of final designs and was issued to City Building on 29th March 2016 with a return date of 8th June 2016 with which City Building complied.
- 2.2 City Building was advised that their tender would be evaluated in accordance with Alternative 2 in JCT Series 2 Practice Note 6. After clarifications, value engineering and arithmetical corrections, a final tender price of £22,396,501 was agreed. PM&D have confirmed this represents Best Value.
- 2.3 If awarded, opportunities for further value engineering and cost reductions will continue to be pursued.
- 2.4 The construction duration noted in the returned tender is 107 working weeks. It has been agreed that whilst the tender will be recommended for acceptance based on the 107-week construction duration, discussions will continue within the project team in an effort to reduce the construction period.
- 2.5 The project cost summary is illustrated below:
