1. Purpose

- 1.1. To seek approval of appointment to GCIJB Finance, Audit and Scrutiny Committee and note a number of updates in relation to the membership of Glasgow City Integration Joint Board.

2. Background

- 2.1 The IJB approved the appointment of David Reilly at its meeting on 30th November 2022 as a non-voting member of the IJB representing the Independent Sector, for a three-year term.
- 2.2 The Third Sector Health and Social Care Network is the appropriate forum from which to seek Third Sector representation on the IJB. The network met on 12th January 2023 to begin the process of identifying a representative.
- 2.3 There continues to be a vacancy on the IJB for a Carers representative.
- 2.4 The term of Chris Sermanni, Stakeholder Representative (Trade Union Local Government), expires on 15th March 2023 and therefore to continue to be an IJB member, confirmation is required from the relevant body as to his reappointment or replacement on the IJB.

3. IJB Committee Updates for Approval

- 3.1 As per Regulations and the IJBs own Standing Orders, appointments to Committees of the IJB are a matter for the IJB itself. The IJB Finance Audit and Scrutiny Committee has vacancies for two non-voting stakeholder representatives.
- 3.2 The IJB is asked to approve the appointment of David Reilly to IJB Finance, Audit and Scrutiny Committee, representing the Independent Sector.

4. IJB Membership Updates for Noting

- 4.1 GCVS took the opportunity to be a third sector representative to the Third Sector Health and Social Care network. There was a lot of interest in being the representative and a number of people have put their name forward. GCVS will be working with potential candidates to identify one person to take the place who has the skills and knowledge to undertake it effectively.

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- 4.2 Previously the role of the Carers representative has been combined with the Glasgow City Council role of Carers Champion, however this role is currently vacant and GCC have been unable to appoint a successor. HSCP officers have met with the Carers Reference Group and have been unable to seek a representative from their current membership. HSCP officers are preparing a range of options for discussion with the IJB to look at other ways in which the IJB can meet its duty to appoint at least one non-voting stakeholder member with respect of persons providing unpaid care in the area of the local authority.
- 4.3 Chris Sermanni has been re-appointed for a further term as Stakeholder Representative (Trade Union Local Government).

5. Substitute Arrangements

- 5.1 The IJB's Standing Orders state that any member unable to attend a meeting "may send any suitably qualified individual as a proxy".

The named substitute for the Independent Sector has been confirmed as Gillian Currie.
