Figures are reported through the Community Learning and Development Partnership on which we sit. The city's ESOL Register has given the city a reliable method to record unmet demand, indicative ESOL levels and to plan assessments and shape provision. Recorded data shows, that as of 21 <sup>st</sup> November 2017, there are a total of 11, 422 individuals on the Glasgow ESOL Register of which 4, 226 (37%) are currently in learning, meaning there are 7, 196 (63%) individuals who are not in learning at present.
