4. Glasgow City Council and NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde ⊠			

1. Purpose

- 1.1 This monitoring statement provides a summary of the financial performance of Glasgow City Integration Joint Board for the period 1 April 2021 to 30th September 21 (Health), and to 23rd September (Council).
- 1.2 It is based on information contained in the respective financial systems and includes accruals and adjustments in line with its financial policies.

2. Summary Position

- 2.1 Net expenditure is £0.908m lower than budget to date. Gross expenditure is £0.991m (0.15%) overspent, and income is over-recovered by £1.899m (2.74%).
- 2.2 Appendix 1 shows the current budget variance by both care group and subjective analysis.

3. Budget Changes

3.1 Throughout the financial year, adjustments are made to the original approved budget as a result of additional funding allocations and service developments. During Month 6/Period 7 the net expenditure budget has increased by £7.781m. The changes to the gross expenditure and income budgets are analysed in the table below.

4. Transformation Programme

- 4.1 The overall savings target for 2021/22 is £5.879m. At this stage of the year it is anticipated that actual savings realised will be £5.505m representing 94% of the target
- 4.2 The unachieved savings target from prior years is £2.969m. At this stage of the year it is anticipated that £0.314m is forecast to be achieved. Delivery of savings had been impacted by the need to focus resources in responding to COVID-19. These are mainly linked to savings identified for the Maximising Independence Programme and Transport savings. Programme boards have re-commenced to support major savings initiatives; however, it is anticipated that full delivery will not be achievable in 2021-22.
- 4.3 The savings realised are reflected in the overall financial position reported in this monitoring statement.

5. Reasons for Major Budget Variances

5.1 Children and Families

- 5.1.1 Net expenditure is underspent by £0.676m.
- 5.1.2 Employee costs is underspent overall by £0.444m. There is an underspend of £1.294m due to vacancies and turnover. This is partially offset by overtime in the Children's Houses which is overspent by £0.278m mainly due to absence cover and additional support for young people with complex needs, and Health Visiting which is overspent by £0.622m linked to the unfunded national regrading in 2018.
- 5.1.3 Premises costs is overspent by £0.411m mainly in relation to work planned for the Children's Houses.
- 5.1.4 Third Party and Transfer Payment costs are overspent by £0.410m. Residential Schools are overspent by £0.438m, with current placements totaling 35 which represents a net reduction of 6 since 1 April 2021. Purchased foster placements total 192, a net decrease of 19 since 1 April 2021, with an underspend of £0.521m and provided fostering is underspent by £0.421m with placement numbers totaling 521. In addition, there are overspends in Kinship, Care Leaver/Homelessness placements, Direct Assistance and Personalisation/Direct Payments totaling £0.891m.
- 5.1.5 Income is over-recovered overall by £1.071m. Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children (UASC) income is over-recovered by £0.860m based on cases accepted to date by the Home Office. There is an over-recovery of £0.167m in relation to income from staff secondments and £0.032m for inter-agency adoption placements.

5.2 Adult Services

5.2.1 Net expenditure is underspent by £0.724m.

- 5.2.2 Employee cost are underspent by £2.359m. This underspend is focused mainly in Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services (£1.336m), Sexual Health (£0.401m), Learning Disability (£0.283m), Homelessness (£0.220m). Recruitment is ongoing in all services and as posts are filled the under spend position should reduce. As previously reported there are ongoing recruitment difficulties due to a national shortage of appropriately qualified nursing staff.
- 5.2.3 Purchased Services and Direct Payments are overspent by £1.345m attributable in the main to Learning Disabilities and Mental Health Services. These budgets historically reflect significant pressure due to new demand for support and unachieved savings. In the current year this budget pressure has been suppressed by part year reductions of support linked to Covid (as a result of either the Provider's inability to deliver support, or service users choosing to temporarily reduce support), estimated at £1.5m. Without the impact of Covid, the pressure within these budgets would be in the region of £2.7m, with a full year impact of £4.6m.
- 5.2.4 Mental Health is reflecting an overspend of £0.213m within Premises Costs mainly due to refurbishments & other property work on Inpatient sites and other minor works at Hunter Street for the Complex Needs service.

5.3 Older People and Physical Disability

- 5.3.1 Net expenditure is overspent by £0.749m.
- 5.3.2 Employee costs are overspent by £1.172m, mainly within Operational Care services. This is due to additional staffing to support the service as it responds to COVID including increased levels of sickness absence and an increase to the number of residents with additional support needs.
- 5.3.3 Purchased care homes are underspending by £1.831m to date. The pandemic has had a significant impact on our assumptions, year to date we have seen both a 3% decrease in admissions levels, and a 15% increase in discharge levels over the same time.
- 5.3.4 Other purchased services are overspent by £1.254m. Personalisation is overspent by £2.063m, with a full year impact of £3m, as a result of increased new demand, transitions and unachieved savings. This overspend is offset by continuing underspends in Supported Living, Purchased Homecare and Purchased Day Care.
- 5.3.5 Transport has an overspend of £0.072m within vehicle repairs due to an ageing fleet.
- 5.3.6 There is an under recovery of income of £0.124m mainly within Homecare Services.

5.4 Resources

- 5.4.1 Net expenditure is overspent by £0.688m.
- 5.4.2 Employee costs is overspent by £0.108m due to lack of turnover in within these services.

- 5.4.3 Supplies and Services is overspent by £0.675m. There is an overspend of £0.201m mainly across the Equipu, Stairlifts and Ceiling Track Hoists as activity increases & more equipment is being purchased/utilised by the Equipu Partnership. This is offset by an increase in income recoveries. In addition, there is an overspend of £0.579m resulting from the provision for I.T. licenses which will be renewed this year.
- 5.4.4 There is an over-recovery in income of £0.220m, mainly across the Equipu, Stairlifts and Ceiling Track Hoists which is reflected in the overspend in Supplies & Services. These services have a net position of £0.075m overspend.

5.5 Criminal Justice

- 5.5.1 Net expenditure is underspent by £0.166m.
- 5.5.2 The service is showing an underspend of £0.166m against non-grant funding due mainly to slippage in appointments to vacancies and delays in implementing purchased services.

5.6 Primary Care

- 5.6.1 Primary Care is showing an underspend position of £0.779m.
- 5.6.2 Vacancies within Prescribing Support Services and Health Improvement teams is resulting in an underspend of £0.402m. There are further underspends within Supplies & Services and Third Party of £0.377m as a result of slippage on funding for a new service which is currently in the planning stage.
- 5.6.3 Prescribing is currently showing a break even position which is summarised in the table below.

- 5.6.4 Prescribing volumes remain volatile this year, increases in April have been offset with reductions in the following months. The overspend on Schedule 4 GIC shows the impact of higher prices due to tariff price changes and short supply issues. This is partly negated by one-off windfalls from discount rebates and tariff swap reduction. This will continue to be closely monitored as the year progresses and more data becomes available.
- 5.6.5 The IJB holds earmarked reserves of £2.962m to offer a contingency in this budget due to the risk associated with pricing and also the potential impact of BREXIT.

5.7 Response to COVID-19

- 5.7.1 Funding of costs associated with COVID-19, for services delegated to the IJB, will be routed through Greater Glasgow and Clyde Health Board and passed through to the IJB to meet costs. To date the IJB has received £27.248m, of which £17.125m is held in earmarked reserves and £10.123m has been notified to us on 26 October 2021. To date costs of £12.764m have been incurred.
- 5.7.2 Full year costs of £43m are anticipated and discussions with Scottish Government continue in relation to this funding. The IJB continues to provide the Scottish Government with regular updates in relation to forecasted spend for all services and the cost of responding to the pandemic and this will be used by the Scottish Government in assessing future funding needs. At this stage full funding is anticipated.

5.8 Probable Outturn

- 5.8.1 A probable outturn has been completed for the IJB. However, it should be recognised, that similar to last year, this outturn has been completed with a high level of uncertainty. The IJB continues to operate under the powers introduced by the emergency legislation in relation to Covid 19. As a result, the final position is expected to change as we continue to respond to the challenges of the pandemic over the winter months and await confirmation of future funding allocations from the Scottish Government. In addition, additional funding linked to Winter Planning has recently been allocated by the Scottish Government and is the subject of a separate report to the IJB. If approved, this will have implications for the outturn projected below.
- 5.8.2 An underspend of £4.7m is forecast for services excluding the costs of responding to the pandemic. The table below summarises the main sources highlighting those variances which have occurred as a result of the impact of the pandemic on service delivery and those which are as a result of operational service delivery.

- 5.8.3 The above table shows that the overall position of an underspend for the IJB is mainly as a result of the continued impact that COVID is having on services (underspend of £8.1m). As services fully recover and this reduces over time the operational service delivery pressure of £3.4m will be the area which will represent an on-going pressure for the IJB and will need to be factored into future financial planning both in terms of the full year effect of these pressures but also what does it tell us about what future demand levels look like.
- 5.8.4. If the final position remains an underspend, then this will be considered as part of the IJBs financial plans when the annual accounts close in June and is likely to include smoothing the delivery of unachieved savings carrying forward from this year and service pressures which continue into next year.

- 5.8.5 As outlined in section 5.7, the IJB has incurred additional costs responding to the pandemic. The total cost of this is forecast to be £43.4m for 2021-22. To date funding of £27.2m has been made available by the Scottish Government. This represents a gap in funding of £16.2m to date. The IJB continues to provide the Scottish Government with regular updates in relation to the cost of responding to the pandemic and full funding is anticipated. Although not anticipated, it should be noted that any reduction in funding would be required to be met from general reserves.
- 5.8.6 The overall position will continue to be kept under review and any significant changes reported as we move closer to the year end.

5.9 Health Board Budget Offer 2021/22

- 5.9.1 On 24 March 2021, the IJB agreed to conditionally accept the indicative funding offer from NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde for 2021-22, subject to confirmation when the out-turn for the 2020/21 financial year has been finalised.
- 5.9.2 A letter has now been received confirming the final budget offer from NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde and reflects the indicative offer made to the IJB in March. This also reflects the IJB's share of national funding made available for the pay settlement in 2021-22, which has not been fully funded by Scottish Government. This letter is contained in Appendix 2.

6. Action

6.1 The Chief Officer, along with the Health and Social Care Partnership Senior Management Team, continues to manage and review the budget across all areas of the Partnership.

7. Conclusion

- 7.1 Net expenditure is £0.908m lower than budget to date.
- 7.2 A number of savings initiatives through the transformation programme have yet to achieve the required level of savings. These initiatives are being critically reviewed and closely monitored by the IJB's Integration Transformation Board.
- 7.3 In line with the approved Reserves Policy, any net overspend which may occur within 2021/22 will be met from general reserves at the end of the financial year.

8. Recommendations

2021/22 Financial Allocation to Glasgow Health and Social Care Partnership

Following on from the initial uplift letter sent out in March 2021, I can now update the Boards Allocation to the HSCP for 2021/22, based on further allocations for the Agenda for Change pay agreement. Please note this does not include an allocation for the Medical Pay Award and AFC band 8-9, this has still to be confirmed by Scottish Government.

Annual uplift to NHSGGC

The annual general uplift is provided by the Scottish Government to support Boards in meeting expected additional costs related to pay, supplies (which includes prescribing growth and utilities charges) and capital charges. The Board's initial uplift for 2021/22 is 1.5% totalling £33.7m followed by a further £31.2m for Agenda for Change Pay Uplift

The HSCP Settlement

The Scottish Government's funding allocation letter issued on 28 January 2021 states that "In 2021/22, NHS payments to Integration Authorities for delegated health functions must deliver an uplift of at least 1.5% over 2020/21 agreed recurring budgets".

The total allocation uplift to all six HSCPs should therefore be £13.1m based on the recurring budget at 31 January 2021 followed by a further £7.6m for AFC pay uplift and the partnership's share of this allocation is included in **Appendix 1**.

Set Aside Budget

During 2020/21 work continued to identify the actual budgets and costs of unscheduled care services and these have been used as the basis for the set aside allocation for 2021/22. Now that the final out-turn for 2020/21 is confirmed the current value has been uplifted by 2.12%. This figure represents the estimated actual usage of the in scope Acute services. This will continue to be a notional allocation.

Recharges to HSCPs

The following items will continue to be charged to the HSCP during 2021/22:

- The HSCP's proportional share of the Apprenticeship Levy based on your HSCP's payroll cost; and
- The HSCP's proportional share of the annual cost arising from the change in accounting treatment of pre 2010 pension costs as the non recurring funding generated from this change was used to provide non recurrent support to all service areas in 2016/17.

Non recurring allocations including Scottish Government allocations for COVID-19 for both health and social care expenditure will be passed directly to the partnership when received by the Board.
