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National Care Home Contract Settlement (2022/23)

Purpose of Report:

The purpose of this report is to update the IJB on a one year National Care Home Contract (NCHC) settlement for 2022/23 and the proposed increases on our other commissioned services.

Background/Engagement:

The NCHC is a national contract which is negotiated across Scotland and full engagement of Scottish Councils via COSLA.

1. Purpose

- 1.1. The purpose of this report is to update the IJB on a one year National Care Home Contract (NCHC) settlement for 2022/23 and the proposed increases on our other commissioned services.

2. Background

- 2.1. The NCHC is subject to national negotiation. This negotiation sets the rates which will apply for 2022/23 and the expectations in relation to the payment of the Adult Social Care Pay rate by providers.

3. Implications of 2022/23 fee uplift

- 3.1 The rates attached at Appendix 1 are applicable from 1 April 2022 in line with Scottish Government notification to Local Authorities dated 25 March 2022. A rate of 5.38% has been applied to nursing care and 5.58% for residential care. These rates will be applied to both the NCHC and the other commissioned services which are included at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 The cost of the uplift amounts to £5.218m for 2022/23. Budget provision has been made in the IJB's 2022/23 budget to meet this commitment. The effective date of the increase will be 28 March 2022 due to the system set up within Carefirst.

4. Adult Social Care Pay

- 4.1 The NCHC financial settlement for 2022/23 requires all providers delivering publicly funded care to pay all workers providing direct care, regardless of age, experience or time in employment, a minimum of £10.50 per hour from 1 April 2022 in line with the commitment to the Adult Social Care Pay Policy.
- 4.2 On this basis the National Care Home Contract will be varied to ensure:

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- Any provider delivering publicly funded care must pay all care workers a minimum of £10.50;
- Providers agree that remuneration can be periodically monitored by the commissioning authority, including direct verification with employees of the provider;
- There will be no displacement of other costs onto staff by the employer.

5. Agenda for Change

- 5.1 An increase to nursing salaries of 3% has been included with a commitment to vary this rate to align with the final agreed Agenda for Change pay increase. Any further updates to rates will be the subject of a future report.

6. Further Commitments

- 6.1 This settlement recognises that the Scottish Government has confirmed the continuance of funding for additional covid costs for the care home sector until 30 June 2022 and therefore, covid specific cost pressures are not reflected in the model.
- 6.2 The settlement includes a commitment from local government representatives to work in partnership to agree a mutually acceptable mechanism to address any continuing Covid-19 pandemic pressures currently covered by the aforementioned funding should it cease during the financial year 2022/23.
- 6.3 The settlement recognises that all parties to the negotiations support the need for a redesign of the current NCHC and are seeking to engage in this important work with some urgency. The offer included a commitment to begin this work with them and other key stakeholders as soon as possible.

7. Recommendations
