1. Purpose

1.1 To provide a summary of the Directions issued by Glasgow City Integration Joint Board (IJB) to Glasgow City Council and NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in the period June 2018 to May 2019, and to update Members on a review of the Directions process to reflect learning since establishment of the IJB in February 2016.

2. Background

- 2.1 Issuing of Directions is the method through which the IJB commissions Glasgow City Council and NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde to deliver the priorities outlined within the IJB's Strategic Plan. Directions are legally binding, and the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 and associated secondary legislation establishes the framework within which they operate.
- 2.2 Following a report to the IJB Finance and Audit Committee in <u>February 2018</u> on the use of Directions by the IJB's auditors it was agreed that the IJB receive an annual summary of the use of Directions. This is the second such report, covering the period from June 2018 to May 2019.
- 2.3 This report outlines a summary of the Directions issued by the IJB during the period in scope. The report does not provide detail of the Directions' content or commentary on their impacts, as it is considered that this level of oversight is facilitated through the normal performance scrutiny arrangements of the IJB and the Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership.
- 2.4 This report also takes into consideration the Partnership's learning in relation to the issuing and management of Directions throughout the previous year, as well as draft guidance on Directions produced by the Scottish Government to recommend some improvements and clarifications to the Directions process as used by Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership.

3. Summary of Directions

- 3.1 Between June 2018 and May 2019 (inclusive):
 - the IJB has issued 47 Directions;
 - 21 of these were Directions to both the Council and Health Board; and,
 - 20 Directions were to the Council only, the remaining 6 to the Health Board only.
- 3.2 Of the 47 Directions issued by the IJB:
 - 40 remain open (current); and,
 - 7 are closed and have been superseded (previous).

3.3 The list of Directions issued by the IJB to the Council and Health Board during the reporting period is appended to this report.

4. Directions Process

- 4.1 Glasgow City HSCP are currently conducting an informal review of the Directions process and recording infrastructure to enable best use to be made of the experience gained so far of issuing Directions.
- 4.2 The review is also considering draft updated statutory guidance currently being prepared by the Scottish Government on issuing Directions from Integration Authorities to Local Authorities and Health Boards. An early draft has been shared with Integration Authorities and will be used to inform minor alterations to how Directions are issued, stored and monitored following the decision to issue Directions at Integration Joint Boards.
- 4.3 The key areas where Glasgow City are looking to improve their processes to reflect experience and the new draft guidance includes:
 - When to issue a Direction and when recommendations are sufficient
 - Preventing Directions which cannot easily be monitored or have no logical completion point
 - Ensuring Directions have the level of detail required to meet the standard in the new draft guidance
 - Logging the officer(s) responsible for progressing Directions in back office systems
 - Developing the Directions Log to facilitate reporting and progress monitoring
 - · Adopting Directions "status" categories to reflect the new draft guidance
 - Reviewing the information captured in the template Directions page on IJB cover reports.
- 4.4 Changes made to the Directions process will not have a direct impact on the business of the IJB, but will rather be confined to how Directions are recorded and monitored by staff in Business Development.
