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Glasgow City Integration Joint Board Membership

Purpose of Report:

The NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (GG&C) Board Meeting of 18th December 2025 agreed a change to the membership of Glasgow City IJB.

On 19 December 2025, the Minister for Social Care and Mental Wellbeing, Tom Arthur MSP, laid before Scottish Parliament regulations that extend voting rights to service user, unpaid carer and third sector representatives on Integration Joint Boards.

1. Purpose

- 1.1 To provide an update on changes to the membership of Glasgow City Integration Joint Board (GCIJB) and seek approval of an appointment to the IJB Public Engagement Committee.
- 1.2 To update on an amendment to the Scottish Statutory Instrument to Extend Voting Rights to IJB Lived Experience Representatives.

2. Background

- 2.1 The NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (GG&C) Board Meeting of 18th December 2025 approved a change to the membership of Glasgow City IJB. This change has resulted in a vacancy on the IJB Public Engagement Committee for a Health Board Voting Member.
- 2.2 Dr. John O'Dowd, Clinical Director (professional member) on Glasgow City IJB, has been seconded to the role of Interim Director of Public Health at NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde for a period of 6 months.
- 2.3 On 19 December 2025, the Minister for Social Care and Mental Wellbeing, Tom Arthur MSP, laid before Scottish Parliament regulations that extend voting rights to service user, unpaid carer and third sector representatives on Integration Joint Boards.

3. IJB Appointments for Noting

- 3.1 The NHS GG&C Board, on 18th December 2025, confirmed that Jamie Kinlochan will join Glasgow City IJB as an NHS Non Executive Member (Health Board voting member), replacing Dr. Emilia Crighton who retires in January 2026.

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- 3.2 Interim arrangements are being finalised to cover Dr. John O'Dowd's 6 month secondment to NHS GG&C and a replacement Clinical Director on Glasgow City IJB will be notified in due course.

4. IJB Committee Appointments for Approval

- 4.1 As per Regulations and the IJBs own Standing Orders, appointments to Committees of the IJB are a matter for the IJB itself.
- 4.2 The IJB is asked to approve the appointment of Jamie Kinlochan as a Health Board Voting Member on the IJB Public Engagement Committee, replacing Emilia Crighton.

5. The Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Integration Joint Boards) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2025

- 5.1 On 19th December 2025, the Minister for Social Care and Mental Wellbeing, Tom Arthur MSP, laid before Scottish Parliament regulations that extend voting rights to service user, unpaid carer and third sector representatives on Integration Joint Boards, collectively referred to in the Statutory Instrument as "lived experience" representatives.
- 5.2 This Order amends the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 and will come into force in September 2026.
- 5.3 This move reflects a commitment by the Scottish Government to ensure that those who access and support community health and social care services have an equal say in shaping the decisions that affect their communities.
- 5.4 In the run up to September, further work will be undertaken by the Scottish Government to establish clear processes that support the changes, including a review of the guidance covering recruitment, appointment, training and support of all IJB members.
- 5.5 Updates will be brought to the IJB when further work has been undertaken in terms of the processes being proposed to support the changes.
