The IJB subsequently approved in September 2023 the implementation of a SDCF and development of a full engagement plan.</p> <p>The SDCF Implementation Board has been overseeing implementation of the Engagement Strategy approved by the IJB in November 2023 and remitted to the Communication and Engagement Group. The approach to engagement was presented to and discussed by the Public Engagement Committee in November 2023. A report to the Committee in February 2024 will provide an update on the outcome of the engagement activity to this point.</p> <p>Further update reports will be provided to the Committee during the planning and implementation phase.</p>	Open
