Mental Health

Achievements

- Above target performance for Access to Psychological Therapies in North West
- Occupancy levels starting to reduce

2. Performance Achievements & Areas for Improvement

Alcohol and Drug Recovery Services

Achievements

- All areas exceeding 90% target for clients commencing alcohol or drug treatment within three weeks of referral
- All areas of MAT Standard due to be implemented by April 2025 are currently achieved

Areas for Improvement

- Develop other performance indicators relative to national reporting e.g. Treatment Choice, Access to Psychosocial Interventions, Staff completion rates for trauma informed training, Alcohol Interventions

Currently reviewing the mental health employability service to ensure delivery model is modernised and recovery orientated

Public Consultation on the Mental Health Strategy

Realignment of treatment services to include recovery focussed Supported Treatment and Recovery (STARs) model

- Compassionate Distress Response Service (CDRS)

- Investment in Mental Health Officer Recruitment
 - Recent audit commissioned through SWPG Board leading to review of operational and gov structures
 - Working alongside NHSGGC on emergency detention certificates
- Integrated Discharge Hospital Team currently under review

Safer Drug Consumption Facility: Service aims to reduce harm to individuals and their communities

- Community engagement
- Links with third sector partners

- Staff recruitment involving people with lived experience
- Staff Training Programme

4. Future Service Plans and Challenges

- Implementation of the Mental Health Strategy

 - Finalising the Community Mental Health Acute Care Services model to prevent admissions to mental health inpatient facilities and provide treatment at home (CMHACs)
