Planned end date revised from 30 April 2026 to 31 January 2027 due to ongoing nature of activity. Between 1 April and 30 June 2026 there was engagement with 105 service users and families. Planned and bespoke Home Technology sessions were delivered in community and health centres to 45 participants. Through Alzheimer Scotland, 60 family members and service users recently diagnosed with dementia received Telecare and Technology Awareness sessions. Awareness sessions continue to be delivered regularly and will be maintained as an ongoing part of service provision

01/01/25	31/03/29	Primary Care: Whole Family Support in General Practice evaluation programme undertaken externally by Glasgow University.	Planned end date revised from 31 March 2027 to 31 March 2029 due to additional funding from the Scottish Government <i>Tackling Child Poverty Delivery Plan</i> which has been extended until March 2029. Work continues on the University of Glasgow evaluation. Family Wellbeing Workers will begin using the Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ) alongside the Short Warwick-Edinburgh Mental Wellbeing Scale (SWEMWBS), which is already in use. The SDQ will be used with children and young people to help measure programme impact and outcomes. The University is also establishing a family advisory group to support ongoing engagement with families who have participated in the programme and to gather their views on future development and delivery. To date, two families have expressed an interest in joining the family advisory group. The introduction of the SDQ will strengthen the programme's ability to evidence outcomes for children	●

			and young people and complement existing wellbeing measures collected through SWEMWBS.	
01/04/26	31/03/27	Parkhead Hub: Activity for 2026-2027 comprising of 10,000 engagements with individuals, comprising bookings from third sector and local groups, workshops, tours and network events / meetings. This is in addition to volunteering activity and Local Engagement Forum meetings.	From 1 April to 15 July 2026 there have been 4,050 participations over 507 varied sessions including the Hub's second community network day in May 2026 with 59 stalls and 300 attendees. Community activity at Parkhead Hub continues, with development of an Active Staff Programme, and expansion of support services including the Dementia Heroes Café, a new Alzheimer Scotland support group, and Scottish Action for Mental Health's (SAMH) My Recovery Action Plan. Recruitment is underway for North East Locality Engagement Forum members, while activities such as Play and Stay and Play Café continue over the holidays due to public demand. The fortnightly Network Task Group continues to be well attended, supporting partnership working and planning events, including Cycle to Work Day on 6 August.

01/04/25	31/12/26	Older People & Mental Health: Engagement programme supporting the phased transition of Scottish Huntington Association services for GCHSCP patient/carers.	The planned end date has been extended from 31 August to 31 December 2026 to allow additional time for the collection and analysis of feedback from patients and carers. The service has an active caseload of 80 individuals during Quarter 2, delivering 158 patient contacts through face to face and telephone. Three new diagnoses were added to the caseload, three patients were discharged and Future Care Planning discussions were progressed for 17 individuals. Support was also provided to 18 carers. Thirteen referrals were made to partner services, including Social Work, Occupational Therapy, Rehabilitation, District Nursing and Carers Services. The service delivered awareness raising activities with Mental Health Senior Nurses and GP Link Workers and engaged in research	●

			and professional development opportunities.

A new NHS Lead is currently looking to reconvene the Diagnosis Delivery Group. Once the group has been re-established, the intention is to proceed with the evaluation. The survey remains open however response rates continue to be low, and the deadline has been extended to 31 December 2026 to encourage further participation.	●
