3. Current Payments

- 3.1. Carers who are paid directly by Glasgow HSCP are in receipt of the SRA, however the issue of making payments to providers in the purchased sector was unclear and has been discussed widely nationally and with COSLA. These discussions have now concluded with the outcome that providers of purchased services should receive payment to enable them to pay the SRA.
- 3.2. Payment will be based on whether providers are already paying the SRA or above, which they will need to demonstrate and will be backdated to 1st April 2024.

3.3. The current SRA rates are as follows:
