Purpose of Report:	The purpose of this report is to update the IJB on the increase to the National Care Home Contract (NCHC) fee rates for 2023/24 and the proposed increases on our other commissioned services; and to note the approval by the Chief Officer and Chief Officer Finance and Resources, under delegated authority, on the ground of urgency, to apply the NCHC uplift to commissioned services attached in Appendix 1.

1. Purpose

- 1.1. The purpose of this report is to update the IJB on the increase to the National Care Home Contract (NCHC) fee rates for 2023/24 and the proposed increases on our other commissioned services; and to note the approval by the Chief Officer and Chief Officer Finance and Resources under delegated authority, on the grounds of urgency, to apply the NCHC uplift to commissioned services attached in Appendix 1.
- 1.2. As IJB approval could not be obtained within the required timescale, and in view of the urgent requirement to allow backdated payments to providers who are under significant financial challenge, these proposals were approved by the Chief Officer of Glasgow City IJB and Chief Officer, Finance and Resources under the delegated authority set out in the IJB Scheme of Delegation to officers. Officer approval was in consultation with the IJB Chair and Vice Chair.

2. Background

- 2.1. The NCHC is subject to national negotiation. This negotiation sets the rates which will apply for 2023/24 and the expectations in relation to the payment of the Adult Social Care Pay rate by providers.
- 2.2 On <u>10 May 2023</u>, the IJB agreed to apply an interim uplift of 2.11% to nursing care and an interim rate of 2.70% for residential care. These rates were agreed for both NCHC and other commissioned services in Appendix 1 to the report.

2.3 This report noted that a further update would be provided if a final settlement was agreed for 2023/24. This has now concluded, and section 3 of this report provides details of the final settlement agreed.

3. Implications of 2023/24 fee uplift

- 3.1 The rates attached at Appendix 1 are applicable from 10 April 2023 in line with Scottish Government notification to Local Authorities dated 14 July 2023. A rate of 6.00% has been applied to nursing care and a rate of 5.99% for residential care. These uplift rates will be applied to both the NCHC and the other commissioned services which are included at Appendix 1. These rates include the interim increase agreed on 10 May 2023 and represent the final NCHC settlement for 2023/24.
- 3.2 The additional cost of the uplift amounts to £2.299m for 2023/4, taking the total cost of the 2023/24 uplift to £4.594m. Budget provision has been made in the IJB's 2023/24 budget to meet this commitment.

4. Adult Social Care Pay

- 4.1 As agreed on 10 May 2023, this arrangement requires all providers delivering publicly funded care to pay all workers providing direct care, regardless of age, experience or time in employment, a minimum of £10.90 per hour from 10 April 2023 in line with the joint commitment by Scottish Government and Local Government to paying adult social care workers at least the Real Living Wage.
- 4.2 In addition, the rates set out at 3.1 have benchmarked domestic and catering support staff to the National Minimum Wage, this is £10.42.
- 4.3 On this basis the National Care Home Contract will be varied to ensure:
 - Any provider delivering publicly funded care must pay all direct adult social care workers a minimum of £10.90;
 - Providers agree that remuneration can be periodically monitored by the commissioning authority, including direct verification with employees of the provider:
 - There will be no displacement of any other costs onto staff by the employer.

5. Agenda for Change

An increase to nursing salaries of 6.5% has been included within the settlement in line with the agreed Agenda for Change increase.

6. Recommendations

 - a) note approval by the Chief Officer and Chief Officer Finance and Resources under delegated authority, on the ground of urgency:
