The Mental Health Network is a charity which gives people with a lived experience of mental health an opportunity to participate in improving services They are involved in several different workstreams, and are primarily funded by the NHSGGC to improve community and inpatient mental health care. All their members are involved on a voluntary basis they are not a support service and do not offer mental health interventions.

Developing mental health apps.

Viewing resources for different mental health services, ensuring materials are accessible.

Speaking to university students and trainee clinical psychologists.

Sitting on interview panels for senior NHS role Creating new materials and resources, supporting fundraising activities.

The Network recently received an award from GCVS Wellbeing Fund The funding will be used to set up a Glasgow Young Adults Network, engaging with 18–30-year-olds in the interest of improving mental health provision for this age group.

There will be opportunities for young people to volunteer to co-facilitate this forum the group will take place on Tuesday evenings and there will be opportunities to engage in focus, groups, physical activities, art for wellbeing, among many others. The group will be running April-December 2023 with hopes to continue the work according to funding.
